We dwell in the shelter of the Eternal God, who is our Refuge and our Fortress.

VI

God, the Source of life, the Fountain of all good, has given us dear ones. We rejoice in their love, grow stronger through their care, and are ennobled by their influences. God also has established a natural end for life and earthly companionship. Often we cannot comprehend the larger purpose, yet we trust in God nevertheless. Though the longing within us may seem more than we can bear, we must understand that our grief is according to our blessing. The sorrow of separation is the inevitable price for days and years of precious love. Tears are the tender tribute of yearning affection for those who have passed away but will not be forgotten. Death is not the end. The earthly body vanishes; the immortal spirit lives on with God. In our hearts, also, our loved ones never die. Their love and memory abide as lasting inspiration, moving us to noble deeds and blessing us evermore. In humble gratitude for their lives and love, and with steadfast faith, let us sanctify God's name.

Our thoughts now turn to those who have departed this earth; our own loved ones, those whom our friends and neighbors have lost, the martyrs of our people, the Six Million who perished in the Shoah, and those of every race, nation and faith whose lives have been a blessing to humanity.

The departed whom we now remember have entered into the peace of life eternal. They still live on earth in the acts of goodness they performed and in the hearts of those who cherish their memory. May the beauty of their lives abide among us as a loving benediction.
